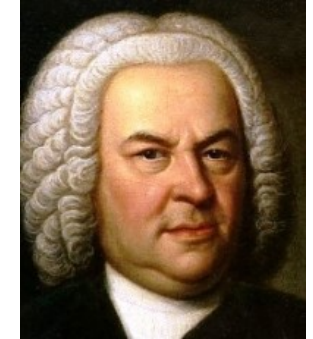

Johann Sebastian Bach was born in 1685 in Germany.

He is one of the most famous composers of the Baroque period, which lasted from 1600—1750.

He wrote lots of music for the Organ, the Harpsichord and the Violin.

A lot of Bach's music was written for the church, and Bach was employed by the church to write music for them.

Bach made the rules of harmony which every composer after him followed.

Minuet for Ukulele

The melody for Minuet is written in TAB below. Each line represents a string on the ukulele, and the numbers tell you which fret to press on that string. The piece has been moved into a different key from the Keyboard activity (to make it easier to play on the Ukulele!), so it will sound slightly different. The rhythm is the same, keep the tempo steady.
