Antonin Dvorak was a Czech composer born in 1841.

Dvorak's music was heavily influenced by traditional folk music, combined with a lyrical orchestral style.

His most famous symphony was his ninth, and it had the title 'From The New World' as he wrote it after moving to America in 1892.

This theme was famously used in a television advert for Hovis bread. It has been nicknamed the 'Hovis Theme'.
