


- For this task, you will compose riff based music on the instruments you have.
- You will take the Pachelbel's Canon Bassline and Chord pattern and create a riff-based piece in several sections.
- For this composing task you must each create 4 riffs that you repeat at various points during your arrangement.
- Think about how you are going to structure your piece: e.g, use contrasting sections, solo sections, call and response etc.
- Look at the instructions below for some ideas.



HOW TO CREATE A RIFF


1. Invent a short rhythmic pattern. E.g.



- 2. Repeat this pattern several times.
- 3. Add notes to it to create a melody



4. Repeat this melody, using 'question and answer' phrases. You can vary the notes that you use.



EXTENSION:

Now harmonise your riffs using intervals of 3^{rd} and 6^{th} . (This means play the next note but one for each of the riffs you use, shown below.)
