Haydn



Franz Joseph Haydn was born in Austria in 1732.


He was instrumental in the development of chamber music such as the piano trio. His contributions to musical form have earned him the titles "Father of the Symphony" and "Father of the String Quartet".

During his lifetime, Haydn wrote 104 symphonies!

He was a friend and mentor of Mozart, and a tutor to Beethoven.



The second staff includes a trill ornament over the final note (A).

The penultimate note in this piece uses a 'ornament' found in many Baroque pieces. This ornament is called a 'trill'. It was used on long held notes to decorate them. Simply play the note written, and then the note above very fast, moving between the two notes.

Surprise Symphony - Ukulele

Now have a go at the Surprise Symphony on the Ukulele. The majority of the piece is played using open strings. We've had to leave out the last note (the octave jump) as the Ukulele doesn't go that low!
