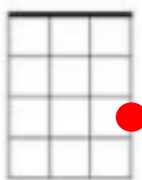
Now that you've mastered the melody, we can add chords. You have the autonomy to choose to play them on the Keyboard or the Ukulele. Use the colours to help you.

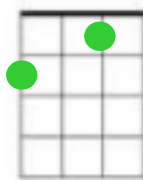

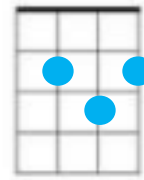
