1. Choose a theme.
(Try to think of something that means something to you, that you know a bit about. E.g. Make poverty history, stop global warming, animals have rights, stop bullying,)
2. Brainstorm phrases. You should write down at least 15 phrases that have something to do with your theme.
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3. Choose your strongest phrase and find as many rhymes for its last word as you can. Don't worry at this stage if they don't make sense.
